In the opening ceremony of the National Maritime Safety and Emergency Intervention Centre (UDEM), Transport and Infrastructure Minister Mehmet Cahit TURHAN, Deputy Minister Omer Fatih SAYAN, Tekirdag Governor Aziz YILDIDIRM, TNKU Rector Prof. Dr. Mumin Marmaraereglisi District Governor Sıdkı ZEHIN Marmaraereglisi Mayor Hikmet ATA, ZESGWES Project Marine Environment Coordinator and Dean of Corlu Engineering Faculty of TNKU Prof. Dr. Lokman Hakan TECER and many protocol members participated.
